2a. DESCRIPTION OF VIOLATION

Act 56 of 2007 requires that "no person, organization, or program shall use the term 'assisted living' in any name or written material" unless the person, organization, or program is an assisted living residence licensed in accordance with 55 Pa. Code Chapter 2800 (relating to assisted living residences). The home is currently using the term on a form, signed by residents #1 and #2, with the heading "Attention: Resident's admitted to Assisted Living or Medication Management." The form further indicates that "Pennsylvania Personal Care Home Regulations prohibit us from allowing residents who are contracted for assisted living services or medication management services from keeping any medications in their rooms."

The home is not licensed as an assisted living residence, and under Ch. 2600, residents who are assessed as capable of self-administering medications may keep medications in their rooms if they are kept locked.


