2a. DESCRIPTION OF VIOLATION

On 08/11/17 in the SCU, Resident # 1 grabbed and forcefully pushed Resident # 2 to the floor. Resident #2 sustained a 3 cm laceration on the scalp which required 4 staples.

3. PLAN OF CORRECTION (POC) (Attach pages as necessary. Remember that you must sign and date any attached pages.)

Resident #1 was admitted to Frederick Living's SCU on [REDACTED] 2017. At time of admission, resident presented with no history or signs/symptoms of aggressive behavior. The incident on 8/11/2017 was witnessed by staff and was unprovoked by Resident #2. Staff immediately intervened to ensure the safety of all residents. Resident #2 was immediately sent to the hospital for emergency medical care and treatment as noted above. Resident #1 was also immediately sent to the hospital for psychiatric evaluation and treatment. Resident #1 was admitted to the hospital for uncontrolled aggressive behavior. On 8/14/2017, resident #1 continued with behaviors and was no longer appropriate for Frederick Living's SCU per policy on Admission Criteria and Services from Admission to Discharge. Please see attached policies. Frederick Living worked with resident's responsible party and the hospital case manager to ensure a safe discharge to another care setting that could safely meet the needs of Resident #1. Resident #1 was discharged from Frederick Living on [REDACTED] 2017. Frederick Living will continue to follow the policies on Admission Criteria and Services from Admission to Discharge to ensure the needs of all residents can be met. Resident care needs will continue to be addressed on the RASP and provide positive interventions to manage behaviors. Managing behaviors associated with dementia will continue to be offered through Frederick Living's staff education program.

The personal care administrator will ensure that these policies are followed by conducting a quarterly review of the policies, RASPs and interventions. K.W. 5/29/18
