82c - Locking Poisonous Materials

1. Requirements

2600.

82.c. Poisonous materials shall be kept locked and inaccessible to residents unless all of the residents living in the home are able to safely use or avoid poisonous materials.

Description of Violation

The assessment/support plan, dated 7/16/2020, indicates that Resident #1 cannot safely use or avoid poisonous materials. On 8/24/2020, at approximately 2:40 pm, Resident #1 consumed approximately 3 oz. of mouthwash out of a 4 oz. bottle.

Plan of Correction

Accept

On or before, September 4, 2020, all Personal Care Licensed and Direct Care Staff will be re-educated by the Executive Director, on the requirement that "Poisonous materials" include any item labeled "seek medical attention if swallowed" or "contact Poison Control Center if swallowed;" that these labels occasionally appear on basic personal hygiene items such as toothpaste, mouthwash, deodorant, hand sanitizer, or shampoo; that some items that are not "poisonous" may still be hazardous to residents who cannot safely use them; that an item with these labels, must be kept locked and inaccessible to residents unless all of the residents living in the home are able to safely use or avoid poisonous or hazardous materials; that residents in our secured memory care unit, Garden View, are not able to safely use or avoid poisonous or hazard materials; that all poisonous or hazardous materials (as defined above) in Garden View, which includes basic personal hygiene items such as toothpaste, mouthwash, deodorant, hand sanitizer, or shampoo, must be kept locked and inaccessible to residents. Staff will be required to sign and date that they received and understood the education. A copy of the staff education document is attached. All new Personal Care Direct Care Staff will receive the same education as a part of their new hire orientation.

The Executive Director or designee will conduct room inspections weekly times four; then twice, for one month; then once per month, for one month; then periodic thereafter, of the rooms in the secure memory care unit, Garden View, to ensure all poisonous and hazardous materials are kept locked and inaccessible to residents.
