2600.

182.b. Prescription medication that is not self administered by a resident shall be administered by one of the following:

1. A physician, licensed dentist, licensed physician’s assistant, registered nurse, certified registered nurse practitioner, licensed practical nurse or licensed paramedic.
2. A graduate of an approved nursing program functioning under the direct supervision of a professional nurse who is present in the home.
3. A student nurse of an approved nursing program functioning under the direct supervision of a member of the nursing school faculty who is present in the home.
4. A staff person who has completed the medication administration training as specified in § 2600.190 (relating to medication administration training) for the administration of oral; topical; eye, nose and ear drop prescription medications; insulin injections and epinephrine injections for insect bites or other allergies.

Description of Violation

Resident #1 is prescribed (). On () and () staff person A administered this medication to (). However, staff person A is not a licensed medical professional and is not qualified to administer this medication.
