## 91 - Telephone Numbers

2600.

*The telephone located in the multipurpose room near [REDACTED] was scheduled to be removed 10/10/24 with the installation of a new telephone system throughout the facility and the telephone line disconnected. Maintenance failed to remove it. The telephone was removed 10/11/24 [REDACTED], RCC performed a whole house walk through and the emergency telephone numbers are posted in each resident room as well as offices, pantries and common areas. Staff will monitor to ensure with weekly room cleans to ensure the numbers remain posted. Copy of emergency numbers attached.*

## 181d - Storing Medication

### 2. Requirements

2600.

- 181.d. If the resident does not need assistance with medication, medication may be stored in a resident's room for self-administration. Medications stored in the resident's room shall be kept locked in a safe and secure location to protect against contamination, spillage and theft.

### Description of Violation

*Resident [REDACTED] self-administers over-the-counter nasal spray and stores this medication in [REDACTED] room. Resident [REDACTED] indicates in interview that [REDACTED] does not secure [REDACTED] medication or lock [REDACTED] room when leaving.*

### Plan of Correction

Accept [REDACTED] - 10/28/2024)

*Resident [REDACTED] is a new admission to the facility as of [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] was brought in after admission by [REDACTED] and the facility staff were unaware of it being brought in. [REDACTED], LPN, PCHA spoke to resident [REDACTED] on 10/11/24 and [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] occasionally will use the over the counter [REDACTED] at night for [REDACTED] dryness related to the use of supplemental oxygen via nasal cannula. That he had used it and did not remember to put it away. It was discussed that any/all medications that are kept in [REDACTED] room need to be secured in a locked storage. [REDACTED] voiced concern that [REDACTED] may not remember to do so, especially at night. With the residents permission the [REDACTED] was removed and resident stated [REDACTED] would speak with [REDACTED] PCP regarding the need and would agree to medications being stored in the med cart and distributed as needed by personal care staff. [REDACTED] RCC, [REDACTED], Med Tech and [REDACTED], Med tech performed a whole house review for medications at bedside and proper storage. [REDACTED], LPN, PCHA purchased new storage boxes and locks and they were distributed to all residents requesting to keep medications at bedside to ensure items were being stored properly. All current residents were informed by [REDACTED], LPN, PCHA of the regulations. Residents also instructed on the use of the locked storage and if found to be unable or unwilling to follow the locked storage procedures, as well as the reporting of over the counter items being brought in to the facility, they would be unable to keep medications at bedside. Staff will monitor daily during medication administration rounds for items being left out after use. New residents on or before admission will be evaluated by their PCP for ability to self medicate and provided with a locked storage*
