On 01/28/25, an opened [redacted] for Resident#1 was in the medication's cart. There was no opened on date listed on the device. According to the manufacturer's instructions and a pharmacy warning label [redacted], unused medication must be discarded 28 days after opening.

On 01/28/25, an opened [redacted] for Resident#1 was in the medication's cart. There was no opened on date listed on the device. According to the manufacturer's instructions and a pharmacy warning label [redacted] unused medication must be discarded 28 days after opening.

On 01/18/25, the expired [redacted] cart with an expiration date of 12/14/24 was immediately discarded and reordered by the assigned nurse. On 1/29/25 the immediate actions taken to correct the deficiencies by the nurse included dating [redacted] with the appropriate open date, discarding the outdated [redacted] and immediately reordering, writing the appropriate open date on the [redacted] and discarding the outdated [redacted] were immediately reordered after discarding. Starting 2/3/25 and ongoing the PCHA will complete a weekly quality

assurance check to include a medication inventory review to ensure all prescribed medications are available, dated, and not expired by Friday of every week. Starting 2/1/25 The assignment nurse will coordinate with the pharmacy immediately for timely refills and delivery of medications to replace anything not in compliance. Visual aids on how and when to reorder medications were posted in the medication cart rooms for staff reference on 2/13/25 by the PCHA. Nursing will be provided a reeducation on proper storage of medications on 2/28/25 by the Director of Nursing.

All staff will receive a reeducation on proper medication storage and management of medications by the PCHA by 3/7/25
