15a - Resident Abuse Report

1. Requirements

2600.

15.a. The home shall immediately report suspected abuse of a resident served in the home in accordance with the Older Adult Protective Services Act (35 P. S. § § 10225.701—10225.707) and 6 Pa. Code § 15.21—15.27 (relating to reporting suspected abuse) and comply with the requirements regarding restrictions on staff persons.

Description of Violation

On [redacted], at approximately 6:00 p.m., resident #1 told staff person A that another resident came into [redacted] bedroom, pulled [redacted] hair and scratched [redacted]. However, this allegation of abuse was not reported in accordance with the Older Adult Protective Services Act.

Plan of Correction

Accept [redacted] - 03/18/2025)

In March, the staff will again be trained on Residents Rights, Abuse and Abuse Training, and What Are Reportable Incidents using the Regulatory Compliance Guide Supplemental Staff Training manual. On March 4, staff attended a training session on abuse reporting provided by a representative from the Agency on Aging. Staff who were not in attendance were given the training materials to review and acknowledge completion. In addition, the interim administrator will conduct mandatory training with all staff to review scenarios that have been composed which describe multiple situations where abuse may have occurred. These will be discussed in detail with the entire staff to reinforce awareness of signs of possible abuse. Staff will be reminded that any suspected abuse must be reported immediately to either their supervisor or the Area Agency on Aging.

16c - Written Incident Report

2. Requirements

2600.

16.c. The home shall report the incident or condition to the Department's personal care home regional office or the personal care home complaint hotline within 24 hours in a manner designated by the Department. Abuse reporting shall also follow the guidelines in § 2600.15 (relating to abuse reporting covered by law).

Description of Violation

On [redacted], at approximately 6:00 p.m., resident [redacted] told staff person A that another resident came into [redacted] bedroom, pulled [redacted] hair and scratched [redacted]. The home did not report this incident to the Department.

Plan of Correction

Accept [redacted] - 03/18/2025)

At the end of each shift/beginning of next shift, outgoing shift supervisor and incoming shift supervisor will review the Daily Communication Sheet to identify any incidents that may have occurred in the previous shift. This will make the incoming shift aware if there is a potential reportable incident that may need to be reported, or confirm that a report was filed within 24 hours. If there is any doubt whether or not a required report has been made, the shift supervisor will immediately contact the ARCD or Interim Administrator to clarify. If necessary, a report will be filed immediately by the ARCD or Interim Administrator within 24 hours. A memo with this procedure has been posted for shift supervisors with space for their acknowledgment.
