81b - Resident Personal Equipment

1. Requirements

2600.

81.b. Wheelchairs, walkers, prosthetic devices and other apparatus used by residents must be clean, in good repair and free of hazards.

Description of Violation

Resident [REDACTED] has an enabler bar attached to their bed. At 9:30 a.m. the enabler bar was not attached securely to the bed frame and could be maneuvered side to side easily, creating an entrapment risk.

Plan of Correction

Accept [REDACTED] - 04/29/2026)

In response to the violation identified on [REDACTED] by the Pennsylvania Bureau of Human Services Licensing, immediate corrective action was taken on 04/02/2026 by the Medical Coordinator. During the inspection, it was identified that the enabler bar was not securely attached to the bed frame. At the time of review, the enabler bar was observed to be attached to the box spring; however, it was immediately adjusted and secured to ensure stability and to address the concern identified during the inspection.

To enhance current operations and ensure continued compliance, in accordance with 55 Pa. Code §2600.81(b), the enabler bar was further evaluated and subsequently removed to ensure the equipment remained free of hazards and to promote resident safety. The resident has been reassessed regarding mobility and positioning needs, and appropriate assistance is being provided by staff.

The facility has an established monthly inspection process for resident equipment and will continue to conduct these inspections. Maintenance will perform monthly inspections of resident equipment, including beds and any attached apparatus, to ensure they are properly secured, maintained in good repair, and free of hazards, in accordance with 55 Pa. Code §2600.81(b).

In addition to scheduled inspections, direct care staff will continue to observe resident equipment during routine care and report any concerns immediately to ensure prompt corrective action. Any deficiencies identified will be corrected immediately, and findings will be documented and reviewed by the Administrator or designee to ensure continued compliance and support ongoing quality improvement.

102i - Soap Dispenser

2. Requirements

2600.

102.i. A dispenser with soap shall be provided within reach of each bathroom sink. Bar soap is not permitted unless there is a separate bar clearly labeled for each resident who shares a bathroom.

Description of Violation

At 9:20 a.m. an unlabeled bar of soap was found in the bathroom shower near room [REDACTED]

Plan of Correction

In response to the violation on [REDACTED] by the Pennsylvania Bureau of Human Service Licensing, immediate action was taken on 04/02/2026 by the Direct Care Staff to remove the unlabeled bar of soap from the shared resident bathroom. To enhance the currently compliant operations, on 04/09/2026 the Administrator re-educated staff on infection control practices and proper labeling of personal hygiene items and will ensure that

all resident hygiene items are labeled appropriately, with a completion date of 04/09/2026. Housekeeping Staff will perform daily inspections of resident bathrooms to ensure that personal hygiene items are properly labeled and stored, and Direct Care Staff will check bathrooms after resident use, including after showers, to ensure no personal items are left behind, and the Administrator or designee will conduct random weekly inspections to verify staff compliance, through 05/22/2026 to maintain ongoing compliance with proper labeling and storage of resident hygiene items. Any deficiencies will be corrected immediately, and findings will be documented and reviewed internally for continuous improvement purposes.

103e - Left Overs

3. Requirements

2600.

103.e. Food served and returned from an individual's plate may not be served again or used in the preparation of other dishes. Leftover food shall be labeled and dated.

Description of Violation

At 9:40 a.m. there was an unlabeled, undated bag of frozen hotdogs found in the freezer in the kitchen.

At 9:40 a.m. there was an unlabeled, undated package of left over sliced bacon found in the refrigerator in the kitchen.

Plan of Correction

Accept [redacted] 04/29/2026)

In response to the violation on [redacted] by the Pennsylvania Bureau of Human Service Licensing, immediate action was taken on 04/02/2026 by the Dietary Staff to discard all unlabeled and undated food items from the refrigerator and freezer.

To enhance the currently compliant operations, on 04/09/2026 the Administrator re-educated dietary staff on proper food storage procedures, including the requirement that all food items, including leftovers and newly stored items, be clearly labeled and dated, and will reinforce the facility's labeling process, completion date of 04/09/2026.

Dietary Staff and Direct Care Staff will continue to ensure that all food items are properly labeled and dated at the time of storage, and the Administrator or designee will conduct random weekly inspections of food storage areas to verify compliance, through 05/22/2026 to maintain ongoing compliance with proper labeling and dating of food items Any deficiencies will be corrected immediately, and findings will be documented and reviewed internally for continuous improvement purposes.
