On April 23rd 2026 when medication was founded by inspector. Nurse removed the [REDACTED] take 1/2 tablet by mouth every hours as needed for Resident #1 that was discontinued on April 13th 2026 and discarded it.

On April 23rd 2026 when medication was founded by inspector. Nurse removed the [REDACTED] take 2 by mouth every 4 hours as needed, prescribed for resident [REDACTED] that was discontinued on April 10th 2026 and discarded it.

May 6th 2026 full cart audit completed by Director of Nursing to ensure current compliance. (documentation to be provided)

Starting May 13th 2026 weekly med cart audits will be completed by Director of Nursing and or Assistant Director of Nursing for 4 weekson Wednesdays then monthly for 4 months after that. (documentation to be provided)
