Description of Violation

Staff person A was hired on [REDACTED] and their background check was not initiated until [REDACTED]

Plan of Correction

Staff Person A's criminal background check was immediately obtained and reviewed to verify eligibility for employment. The Administrator, [REDACTED], conducted a comprehensive audit of all employee personnel files to ensure that required criminal history checks. An employee hiring checklist has been implemented and must be completed by the Administrator prior to an employee's first day of employment. The Administrator, [REDACTED], and other staff/ownership involved in hiring were retrained on the requirements of 2600.51 and applicable provisions of the Older Adult Protective Services Act.

2. Requirements

2600.

95. Furniture and Equipment - Furniture and equipment must be in good repair, clean and free of hazards.

Description of Violation

The bathroom located across from resident #1 's bedroom does not have a window, and the bathroom ventilation system was inoperable.

Plan of Correction

Accept ([REDACTED]) - 06/30/2026)

Upon inspection, the bathroom ventilation fan was found to be heavily soiled with dust and debris, which impaired its performance. The ventilation fan was thoroughly cleaned immediately. Following cleaning, the ventilation fan was tested by Owner, [REDACTED], and confirmed to be operating properly. An inspection of all bathroom ventilation fans within the home was conducted to ensure proper operation and cleanliness. To prevent recurrence, bathroom ventilation fans have been added to the facility's bi-weekly maintenance checklist. Maintenance personnel will inspect, clean as needed, and document the condition and operation of all ventilation fans on a routine basis. Any ventilation fan found to be operating improperly or showing excessive dust accumulation will be addressed immediately through cleaning, repair, or replacement as necessary.

- 103.g. Food shall be stored in closed or sealed containers.

103g - Storing Food (continued)**Description of Violation**

At approximately 1:45 p.m., there were waffles in the freezer located in the home's kitchen that were opened and unsealed.

Plan of Correction**Accept () - 06/30/2026)**

The opened package of waffles was immediately discarded. Kitchen staff were retrained on proper food storage requirements, including the requirement that opened food items be maintained in sealed or closed containers. Kitchen staff along with Owner, [REDACTED], completed an inspection of all food storage areas to ensure compliance with food age requirements. Weekly kitchen inspections have been implemented to monitor food storage practices and ensure continued compliance. Food storage requirements will be reviewed during orientation and annual training for all staff responsible for food handling.

105.g. To reduce the risks of fire hazards, lint shall be removed from the lint trap and drum of clothes dryers after each use. Lint shall be cleaned from the vent duct and internal and external ductwork of clothes dryers according to the manufacturer's instructions.

Description of Violation

On 6/3/26 at approximately 9:45 a.m., there was an article of clothing located next to the dryer's heat source.

Plan of Correction**Accept () - 06/30/2026)**

The article of clothing was immediately removed from the area surrounding the dryer. Staff was retrained regarding fire safety requirements, including maintaining a clear area around dryers and other heat-producing equipment. The laundry room was inspected by Owner, [REDACTED], to ensure no materials were stored near the dryer or other heat sources. A laundry room safety checklist has been implemented requiring staff to inspect the area around the dryer at the conclusion of each laundry shift.
