17. Resident records shall be confidential, and, except in emergencies, may not be accessible to anyone other than the resident, the resident's designated person if any, staff persons for the purpose of providing services to the resident, agents of the Department and the long-term care ombudsman without the written consent of the resident, an individual holding the resident's power of attorney for health care or health care proxy or a resident's designated person, or if a court orders disclosure.

Description of Violation

On [REDACTED] at 9:05 AM, there was a green plastic bin with an opened lid sitting on top of the east hallway medication cart. The bin contains empty pill packs that include resident names and names of prescribed medications including for Resident [REDACTED]'s [REDACTED] take one tablet by mouth daily (GERD). In addition, there is a plastic bag lying atop the computer that has Resident [REDACTED] name and the name and purpose for the resident's prescribed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] apply topically to right shoulder 2 times a day for pain.

On [REDACTED] at 9:08 AM, there was a controlled substance inventory binder lying unattended and accessible atop one of the medication carts in the center hallway. The binder contains protected health information including Resident [REDACTED] name and the name of [REDACTED] prescribed [REDACTED], take 1 tablet by mouth twice daily for severe pain. Additional green plastic bins used to discard empty pill packs were present atop the two medication carts in the center hallway and both were missing lids and contained empty pill packs with protected health information.

On [REDACTED] at 9:12 AM, the east center medication cart was unlocked, unattended, and accessible and the computer terminal atop the cart was in the open position displaying the Resident [REDACTED] medication list and diagnosis information.

On [REDACTED] at 12:44 PM, a computer terminal atop the medication in the lobby/dining room area was unlocked and unattended allowing access to the the names, prescription information, and other protected health information of residents of the home.

On [REDACTED] at 12:45 PM, a plastic cup containing Resident [REDACTED] tablet and two [REDACTED] MG tablets was on the dining room table at which the resident and two other residents were sitting. Resident #5 stated that staff person A passed these medications to [REDACTED] earlier. Staff A marked the medications on the medication administration record as administered, however, failed to watch Resident [REDACTED] ingest them.

On [REDACTED] at 9:10 AM, the east center medication cart is unlocked and unattended and permits access to resident medications including Resident [REDACTED] tablets.

On [REDACTED] at 9:15 AM, a round brown pill was lying on the floor of the activity area / lobby by the television.

On [REDACTED] at 12:45 PM, a plastic cup containing Resident [REDACTED]'s [REDACTED] tablet and two [REDACTED] MG tablets was unlocked and accessible on the dining room table at which the resident [REDACTED] and two other residents were sitting.

On [REDACTED] at 12:50 PM, there was a round yellow pill and a single-use vial of Refresh eye drops on the floor next to the closet by the dining room.
